Eyewash

Concern has been raised with respect to the temperature environment for the eyewash stations due to the declaration on the eyewash bottles which limits the storage of the bottles to 25 degree Celsius. This issues has been investigated and the following has been concluded:

Always use goggles whenever working with machinery, products or liquids, where there is a potential risk of getting something in the eye.

Keep the eyewash bottles where they have always been, and exchange them as you have done until now.

In this case you will hardly ever need to use the eyewash procedure.

And even when the liquid is needed there is no risk of the eyewash harming the eye what ever the outside temperature is. Even in the case where the liquid temperature is above 40-45 degrees Celsius it might only cause some discomfort, but will still do the job: Cleaning the eye for harmful potentials.

Thus there is no need for changing eye wash procedure in Danish vessels due to voyage in external warm climate.
